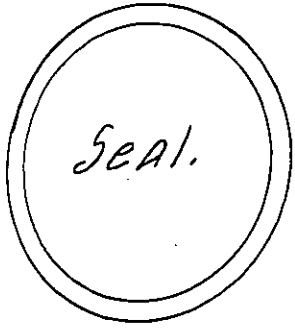

At the Request of Abel Janney That I would grant him a
Resurvey on a certain Tract of Land. Situate in the County
of Bucks & Township of Makefield adjoining on the Land of
his brother Thomas Janney ~ reputed to be 250 Acres and
is part of 550 Acres formerly laid out to his father Tho. Janney
deceased, in right of his Purchase and by him was left to his
son Jacob who sold it to his brother ye Sd. Abel Janney. These
are to require thee forthwith to Resurvey or cause to be re-
survey'd ~~to him ye sd. Abel~~ the sd. Tract of Land according to its
first Lines and true Boundaries, and make an exact Return
thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand
and Seal at Philadelphia the 10th. day of the 11th. Moth. 1700.
