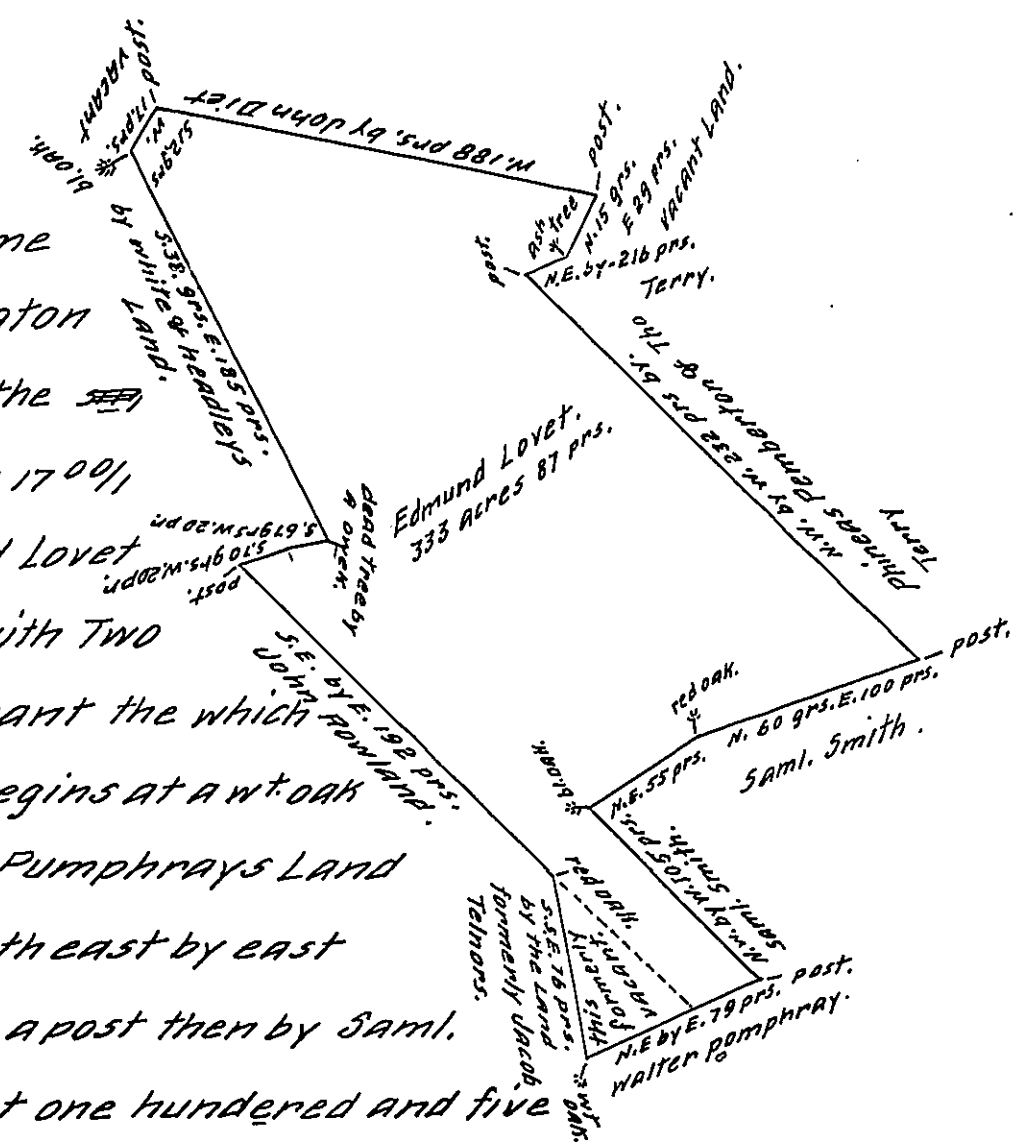


Pursuant to a warrant to me directed by Edward Penington surveyor General, dated the 14th day of the 11th month 1700, to resurvey unto Edmund Lovet a certain Tract of Land with two small pieces of Land vacant the which Land is contiguous and begins at a w^t oak being a Corner of Walter Pumphrays Land thence by the same north east by east seventy nine perches to a post then by Saml. Smith's Land N. w. by west one hundred and five prs. to a small black; - Then by said Smiths Land north East fifty five perches to a black ^{or red} oak Then by said Smiths Land north 60 grs. east one hundred perches to a post Then by Phineas Pemberton & Thomas Terry's Land north west by west Two hundred thirty two perches to a post Then by sd. Terrys Land north east by east sixteen perches to an ash tree standing in a Run of water then by the said run of water north fourteen degrs. East Twenty nine perches to a post by the creek or run side Then west by John Diets Land one hundred eighty eight perches to a post then by vacant Land south twelve degrs. w. seventeen perches to a bl. oak Then south thirty eight degrs. east by Whites & Headleys Land one hundred eighty five perches to a dead tree by the side of the aforesd Run of water then down the said Run south Sixty seven degrs. west Twenty prs. Then by the same south seventy degrs. west Twenty perches to a post Then by the Land of John Rowland South east by east one hundred ninety two perches to Red oak Then by the Land of Edward Wanton formerly Jacob Telnors
