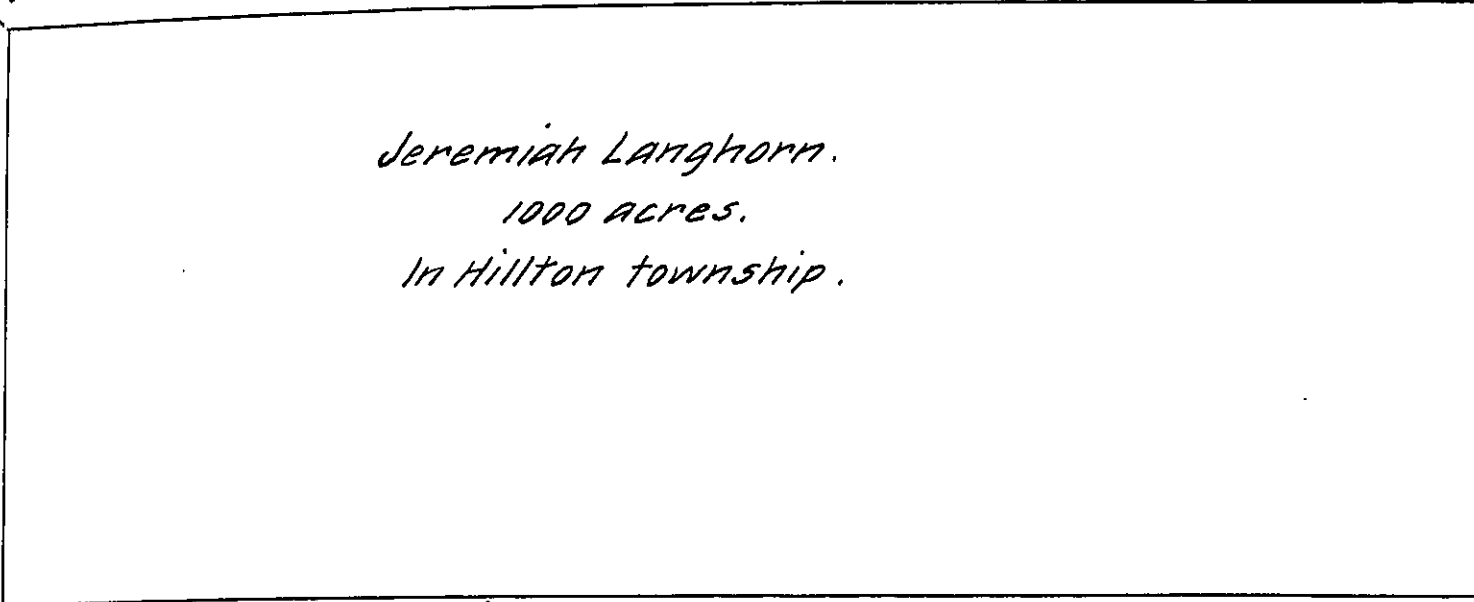

Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commiss^{rs}. of Property dated the 24th. day of July Anno Domini, 1717 to Survey unto Jeremiah Langhorn 1000 acres of Land in the County of Bucks in Right of an Original purchase of 3000 acres made by George Beal [near Guilford in great Brittain] ~~~ Surveyed & laid out unto the sd. Jeremiah Langhorn a tract of Land in Hilton township in the sd. County ~~~ Beginning at a small white Oak in a Line of Charles Brogden's Land. from thence extending by the sd. Line north East six hundred & forty perches to a Hickory tree. Then by vacant Land South East two hundred and fifty perches to a white oak, Then by vacant Land South west six hundred & forty perches to a Hickory tree. Then north west by sd. Jeremiah Langhorn's other Land. two hundred & fifty perches to the place of beginning. Containing one thousand acres. Surveyed the third day of the tenth month. Ano. Domi, 1717. Certified under my hand.
