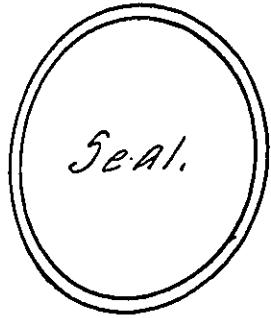


Pennsylvania s. s.

By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Jeremiah Langhorn of the County of Bucks that we would Grant him to take up one Thousand Acres of Land the Remainder of Three Thousand Acres Purchased of the Prop<sup>r</sup> by George Beal near Guilford in Great Britain by Deeds of Lease and Release dated the 7<sup>th</sup>. and 8<sup>th</sup>. dayes of the 11<sup>th</sup>. Month in the year 1701 the Right to the whole [as is alleged] being now vested in the said Jeremiah—These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd within the Said Province in Right of the Said Purchase according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of One Thousand Acres of Land [not exceeding two parcells in the said <sup>one</sup> Thousand Acres] that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office in Order for a further Confirmation. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25<sup>th</sup>. day of the 5<sup>th</sup> Month Anno Dni 1717.
