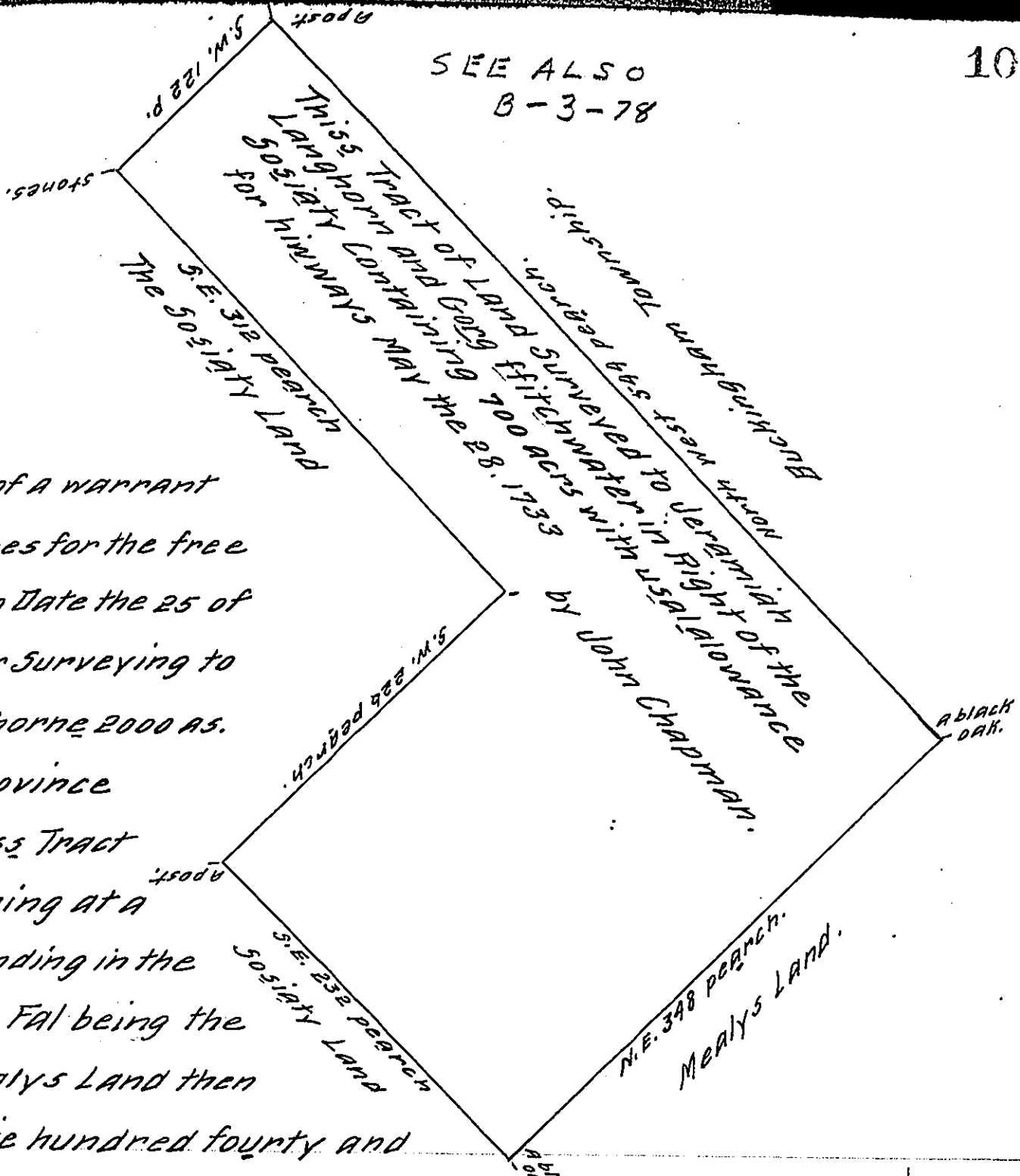

In pursuance of a warrant from the Trustees for the free Societys being Date the 25 of March 1724 for surveying to Jerem<sup>s</sup> Langhorne 2000 acs. in the said Province Surveyed This Tract of Land Beginning at a black oak standing in the line of Joseph Fal being the corner of Mealy's Land then north west five hundred forty and four perch by the lands belonging to Buckingham to a post then south west one hundred and twenty two perches to stones then South East three hundred and twelve perch by the Society Land then by the same south west two hundred twenty six perches to a post then South East two hundred thirty two perches to a black oak then north East three hundred forty Eight perches to the place of beginning containing Seven hundred acs and allowance.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty third day of March 1909-
