

By virtue of a Warrant under the hands and Seals of Charles Read Job Goodsonn Evan Owen & Georg Fitzwater Trustees for the free Society of Traders Requesting me to Survey or cause to be Surveyd unto Jeremiah Langhorn two thousand acres of Land part of twenty thousand acres purchased of the late Proprietary by the said Society This may certifie that there was Surveyd and layd out in part thereof a Tract of Land in Durham in the County of Bucks Beginning at a black oak on the west side of Delaware - a little above the Mouth of Pereletaken Creek from thence by a line of Marked trees South sixty seven degrees West three hundred twenty eight perches Then north twenty three degrees west by a line of Marked trees One thousand and sixty perches Then north sixty seven degrees East two hundred thirty six perches to the bank of Delaware - then down the several Courses thereof to the place of Beginning Contain- ing One thousand and two hundred acres.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty third day of March 1909-
