



By virtue of a Warrant from the Commrs. of Property bearing date the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 4<sup>th</sup> month 1712 Surveyed & laid out unto Jeremiah Langhorn & John Chapman [Assignees of John Decow] a tract of Land near the great Swamp in Bucks County in right of Isaac Decow's purchase of 2500 acres, the sd tract beginning at a Hickory tree on the East side of a small Run of water, from thence Extending South by vacant Land two hundred & Eighty perches to a black Oak, Then West one hundred & fifteen perches to a white oak, Then north two hundred & Eighty perches to another white oak, Then East [all by vacant Land] one hundred & fifteen perches to the place of beginning, Containing two hundred acres, laid out the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month Anno Domini 1712.
