Son and Heir of the Said John Brock. Sold to the Said Jeremiah Langhorn. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the Said Jeremiah Langhorn. According to the Method of Townships appointed the Said Quantity of four Hundred and forty Acres of Land in ye Sd. Province that hath not been already Survey'd nor Appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Returne into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation. Given under our hands and Seale of ye Province at Philadelphia ye Thirteenth day of the Sixth Month Anno Dni. 1714.
