



By virtue of a Warrant from Jacob Taylor Surveyor Genl. to me directed bearing date the 16<sup>th</sup> of August 1714. Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 26<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1714. Resurveyed unto Nicholas Gilbert in right of his father Samuel Gilbert a Tract of Land in War-  
in Bucks County  
 mester, bought of William Carter in Right of Sarah Woolman's Purchase Beginning at a Post in the County Line being also the Corner of Henry Comly's Land, from thence running North East by the sd. Comly's Line three hundred perches to a Post. Then South East by Jonas Jones Land one hundred thirty eight perches to a Spanish Oak, Then by Henry English Land South West three hundred perches to a Post in the sd. County Line, Then by the sd. Line North West one hundred thirty eight perches to the place of beginning. Containing two hundred forty Six acres with allowance according to Law, Resurveyed the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month 1714.
