in Chief of the Province of Pennsylvania and
Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Richard Hough of Bucks-That I would
grant him a Resurvey on a Tract of Land in the Said County
formerly laid out to him, ^{for 250 Acres} by virtue of my Warrant in right
of his Purchase of 500 Acres in England and is Scituate
between the Lands of Thomas Janey and Luke Brunslly.
Also that I would grant him a Resurvey on another Tract in
the Said County ~~scituate~~ taken in Execution on the Land of Luke
Brinly to whom it was granted by Patent and Sold to ye sd.
Rd. Hough by the Sheriff for 50 Acres Situate and joyning on
the forementioned Tract of 250 Acres. These are to require
thee forthwith to resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd to ye sd.
Richd. Hough the two foresaid Tracts of Land according to
the first Lines and true Boundaries thereof and make Re-
turns into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand
and Seal at Philadelphia the 8th of ye 11th Moth. 1700.
