



By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the 27<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month 1712 Resurveyed unto John Hough junr. a tract of Land lying in Buckingham in the County of Bucks Beginning at a White Oak in Matthew Hues Line, from thence running by the sd. Hues Land South East 172 perches to a Post, Then South West by Isaac Decow's Land 410 perches to a great White Oak, Then by Thomas Mayleigh's Land North West 172 perches to a black Oak Sapling; Then North East by the Proprietor's Land 410 perches to the place of beginning Containing four hundred & forty acres & one hundred & twenty perches, Resurveyed the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> month 1712.
