By vertue of a warrt. To me directed from the Propr<sup>s</sup>. Comrs. dated ye 10<sup>th</sup>. day of the first Mo. 1694. I do hereby Certifie into ye Secretaries office. That there was Resurveyd and Laid out for James Hill of Burlington a Certaine Tract of Land w<sup>th</sup>in the County of Bucks Begining at a black oak Tree. Standing at the head of Edward Lucas Land and marked on foure sides for a Corner & Extends thence due west along ye Lands of John Rowland on ye South one hundred & fifty Chaines or 600 perches to a gum Tree in Randolph Blackshaws Land there marked for a Corner thence due north along by ye Lands of sd. Randolph Blackshaw on ye west one hundred twenty foure perches To a poplar there Marked for a Cornr. thence due East five hundred & forty perches along by the Lands of Samll. Dark on ye North to a Corner stake. thence South South East one hundred forty foure pches. To the 1<sup>st</sup>. Mentioned station & Containeing foure hundred forty two acres, and is accordingly Entred
