



By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property to me directed bearing date the 11th day of the 6th month 1702 Resurveyed unto Thomas Hilborne a Tract of Land in Newtowne in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a Post being Israel Morris's Corner, Thence by the said Morris's land North 11 degrs. West 306 perches to a Post, Then N. 74 degrs. E. 23 perches to a heap of Stones, Then N. 8 degrs. W. 251 perches to a small Hickery, Then by vacant Land E. 21 degrs. S. 389 perches to a Post. Then by Jonathan Eldridge Land S. 13 degrs. W. 466 perches to a black Oak at the side of the Town Lott. Then E. by S. 41 perches to a Stone Then S. by W. — perches, Then E. by S. 2 per. Then S. by W. 27 1/2 perches to a heap of Stones, Then by the said Eldridge's Town Lott W. by N. 146 perches to a Stone at the side of the Town Common. Then by the said Common N. by E. 87 1/2 perches to a heap of Stones, Then by the same, and Edmund Cowgill's Lott W. by N. 92 perc. to the place of beginning Containing 980 Acres A Tract of 500 Acres not mentioned in the said Warrant formerly belonging to Arthur Cook being included because it lyes between the two parcels mentioned in the said Warrant. Resurveyed the 13th day of the 6th month 1702.
