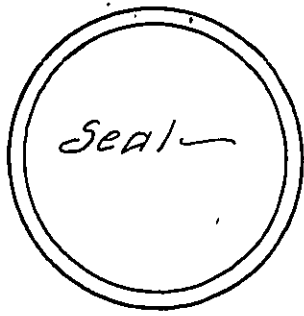


*Pensilvania ss.*

*By the Commissioners of Property.*

*At the Request of Thomas Mayberry Blacksmith. That we would Grant him to take up a small quantity<sup>out</sup> of ye vacant Land in the Townsted of Newtown in the County of Bucks for a Settlement — to carry on his Trade for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use in three months after the date hereof after the rate of eight shillings p-Acre. These are to Authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Thomas Mayberry the quantity of ten Acres or more not exceeding twenty at utmost in such manner as the Settlement of the said Townsted may as little as possible be incommoded or obstructed according to which thou art to regulate as well the quantity as situation and figure of the said Land and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey in case the sd. Thomas fulfill the said Agreement shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 17<sup>th</sup> day of the 5<sup>th</sup> Month A.D. 1716.*
