

FORM NO 1.

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 11th day of November Anno, 1718, requiring me to Survey on cause to be Survey'd to Morris Morris of Abington One thousand acres of land at or near the Great Swamp in the County of Bucks. I do hereby certifie that on the 29th day of the same Month and year there was Survey'd to the said Morris Morris a piece or parcel of Land in part of the said thousand acres in the said Great Swamp. Beginning at a hickory tree in Joseph Growdons line [about 32 perches from the North corner of the said Growdons land] And running from thence South by the said line two hundred and two perches to a white Oak Then West by a line of trees four hundred and twenty perches to another white Oak. Then North two hundred and two perches to a third white Oak. Then East four hundred and twenty perches to the place of Beginning, containing five hundred and thirty acres Also one other piece of Land in part of the said thousand acres. Survey'd the twelfth of the second Month, 1721 in the said Great Swamp. Beginning at two white Oaks in Joseph Gilberts line and running by the same. South Seventy perches to a white Oak. Then West eight perches to a white Oak. Then South by another piece of land, belonging to the said Morris two hundred and ninety perches to a post by a white Oak. Then South by Edward Robert's Land one hundred and twenty four perches to a Small Gum tree. Then North ^{three} hundred and sixty perches to a white oak. Then East one hundred thirty two perches to the place of Beginning containing two hundred eighty two acres Survey'd also to the said Morris Morris on the said twelfth day of April in the same year, 1721 a third piece of land in the said Great Swamp. Beginning at a white Oak in Joseph Growdon's line and running from thence South by a line of Trees two hundred
