to be Surveyed unto him ye said numbr. of acres in ye a-  
fore mentioned County and his Preportion of Land within  
ye Liberts of ye City of Philadelphia, <sup>& his lot there where it fell</sup> in a place not already  
taken up according to ye Method of Township appointed by  
ye Governr. And make he Seat<sup>ing</sup> and Improvieng upon ye  
same w<sup>th</sup>in six moneths after ye Date of Survey and make  
returne thereof into ye Governrs Secretarys office.
