



Surveyed and Laid out the 26th day of the 3^d month 1702 unto Widow Musgrove in right of Richard Baker first purchaser. By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries and Governour, directed to Edward Penington, Surveyor General [and upon his decease directed to me by the Commissioners.] bearing date the 26th day of the 5th month 1701, a Tract of Land in the Township of Buckingham in the County of Buck- beginning at a Corner marked white oak at Daniel Jacksons Corner. Thence N.W. by Land for a Road 160 perches to a Post by a black oak Saplin- Then by vacant land N.E. 500 perches to a Post in an Indian field, Then by Land for a Road S.E. 160. perches to a great Chestnut tree and a small one growing together, being Mary & Alice Hinde's Corner. Then by the said Hinde's and Daniel Jackson's land S.W. 500 perches to the place of beginning Containing 500 acres.
