Returne of a tract survey'd and layed out for Humfery Murrey purchaser of 250 acres and 100 acres added w<sup>ch</sup> he purchas<sup>d</sup> of myselfe the whole 350 acres scituate & being in the Cheltenham township next to the land of Tho. Phillips beging at small oke tree standing in a little run or branch of Quisenarians creeke thence S.W. 480 perches to a white oke tree marked for another corner and thence N.W. 116 1/2 perobl. to a post standing on the south side of a little branch of Wischtoobl. thence N.E. 480 perch—by a line of marked trees to a w. oke for another corner and thence 116 1/2 perch—to the first named oke tree in the run containing and layed out for three hundr obl. and fifty acres.
