At the request of Humphry Murry and John Budd both of Philadelphia that we would grant them to take up two thousand nine hundred <sup>and twenty</sup> acres of land in this Province the remainder of five thousand acres the original purchase of William Bacon of the Middle Temple Gent. made of the Prop<sup>r</sup> by deeds of lease & release dated ye 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> days of October Anno — 1681 and since by other deeds the whole is vested in the said Humphry — and John — These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd in one or more parcels unto the said Humphry Murry & John Budd according to the method of townships appointed in this Province the said two thousand nine hundred <sup>and twenty</sup> acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office in order for a further confirmation. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 28<sup>th</sup> day of the sixth month Anno Dni. 1719.
