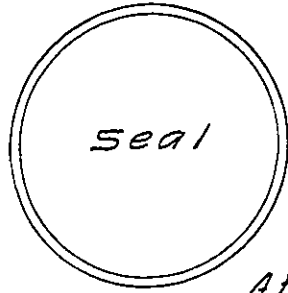

By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Humphry Murry and John Budd both of ye City of Philadelphia that we would grant them to take up in this Province the quantity of two thousand acres ~~of~~ of land in part of five thousand acres the original purchase of William Bacon of the Middle Temple Gent. made of the Propriet^r by deeds of lease & release dated ye 11th & 12th dayes of October ¹⁶⁸¹ who by like deeds dated ye 19th & 20th dayes of the month called Feb^r last past granted the said five thousand acres with ye appurtenances unto the said Humphry Murry and John Budd. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Humphry Murry & John Budd in the said Province according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two thousand acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys office in order for a further confirmation. Given under our hands & the seal of ye Province at Philad^a ye 5th day of ye 3^d month A. D. 1719.
