At the request of John Morris, that we would grant him to take up a second five hundred acres of land ~~part~~ ^{part} of two thousand five hundred acres by him bought of Thomas ffairman who purchased of Thomas Harley his right of five thousd acres purchased of the Prop^{rs}. These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd to the sd John Morris according to the method of townships appointed the sd number of five hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by the Indians, to be seated by the sd John Morris or his assigns within two years after the date hereof otherwise the sd survey to be void and of no other effect than if the same had never been made and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 8th day of x. br 1701.
