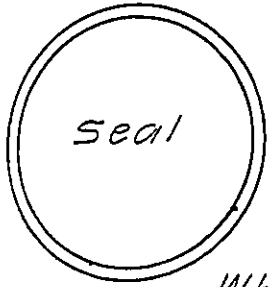

By the Commissioners of Propriety.

Whereas the Proprietor by deeds dated the 21<sup>st</sup> & 22<sup>d</sup> of Decemb<sup>r</sup> 1681 granted unto Gilbert Mace of London five hundred acres of land in this Province and the said Gilbert — by deeds dated 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> of May 1684 granted one moiety thereof to Jn<sup>o</sup> Marlow who sold the same to Elizab. Pace and afterwards the said Gilbert Mace by deeds dated ye 23<sup>d</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> of April 1711 granted obl. the other moiety of ye said 500 acres with all the rights & privileges thereunto belonging to th obl. Jn<sup>o</sup> Marlow, at whose request by his Attorney Jn<sup>o</sup> Estough, that we would grant him to take up obl. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Jn<sup>o</sup> Marlow according to the method of townships appointed the said <sup>moiety or</sup> quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 12<sup>th</sup> of the first month 171<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub>
