John Ap John purchase his lott in ye City of Philade obliterated in breadth fifty foot and in length three hundred ninety and six foot bounded northward w<sup>th</sup> ye lott of Thomas Wynn eastward w<sup>th</sup> Delaw<sup>e</sup> front street southward w<sup>th</sup> a vacant lott westward w<sup>th</sup> ye second street from Delaw<sup>e</sup> and is accordingly entred and recorded in my office Philad. this 1<sup>st</sup> of ye 6<sup>th</sup> mo. 80 bl.
