These are therefore in ye Proprietarys name to will and require thee fforthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him ye said number of acres in ye aforesaid County where not already taken up according to ye method of townships appoynted by ye Govern^r he seating and improveing the same within six months after ye date of survey and make returne hereof to ye Secretarys office dated at Philadelphia ye 12th 6^{mo}. 1685.
