



William Penn Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of ye Province of  
Pennsylvania & ye territories thereunto belonging.

At ye request of William Wood <sup>P</sup> ye I would grant him to take  
up three hundred acres of land in ye township call'd Newtown  
in ye township of Chester. These are to will & require thee forth-  
with to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him ye sd three  
hundred acres two hundred & fifty for John Oldam and fifty  
for himself provided it be not taken up they seating & im-  
proving ye same <sup>th</sup>in one year after ye date of survey & make  
returns thereof into my Secretary's office.

Given at Philadelphia ye 3<sup>d</sup> of ye 6<sup>th</sup> mo. 1684.
