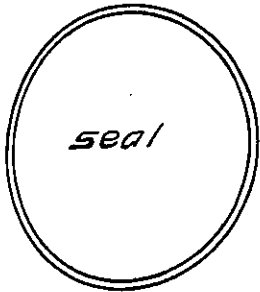


Pensilvania ss.*By the Commissioners of Property.*

At the request of William Tregau of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up among the late surveyes made back in the said County the quantity of two hundred acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use twenty pounds more of Pensilvania for the whole and the yearly quit-rent of one shilling sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said William Tregau back in the said County according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in case the said William _____ fulfill the above agreement within three months after ye date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & ye seal of ye Province at Philad^a ye 25th 1st 1718.
