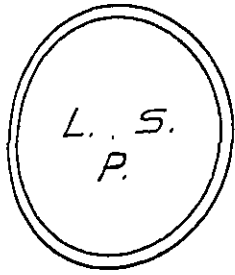

At the request of Rees Thomas and Anthony Morris that we would grant them to take up the quantity of six hundred twenty five acres of land belonging to them in right of Humphrey Souths original purchase of one thousand acres made of the late proprietor and also the quantity of two hundred thirty seven acres which were wanting in the tract of two thousand acres lately confirmed to them in Chester County in right of Joseph Moor, John Moor and Sabian Cole their original purchase made of the said proprietaries. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Rees Thomas and Anthony Morris according to the method of townships the said two quantities of land which together make eight hundred sixty two acres that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make return thereof into the Secretary's office, given under our hands and the lesser seal of the province at Philadelphia the 8th day of 3^{br} Ann-Dom-1727.
