At ye request of Richard Marsh purchaser yt I would grant  
him to take up his lots in ye City proportionable. These are  
to will and require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be sur-  
vey'd unto him on the river Delaware one front obl. & two  
lots in two streets backwards & also on Skoolkill one front obl  
& two lots in two streets backwards in breath proportionable  
obl. ye purchase he fencing y<sup>m</sup> in clearing ye same & build-  
ing upon ye front lots w<sup>th</sup> in six months from date of survey  
& make returns thereof into my Secretarys office. Given at  
Philadelphia ye 25<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> mo. 1684.
