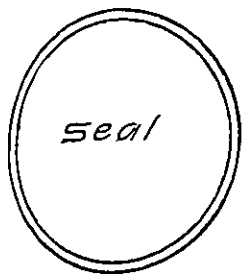


Pennsylvania 5s



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Abiah Taylor of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up two hundred acres of vacant land adjoining to ye land heretofore granted to him in ye said County for which he hath agreed to pay to the Proprietors use four and twenty pounds upon or before the first day of ye twelfth month next ensuing. These are to authorize thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Abiah Taylor the said quantity of two hundred acres of vacant land in the place aforesaid provided that it be not ~~already~~ engaged by any warr<sup>t</sup> already issued and make return thereof into the Secretaries office, which survey in case the said Abiah — fulfill the agreem<sup>t</sup> afores<sup>d</sup> shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warr<sup>t</sup> ever granted. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 4<sup>th</sup> day of Nov<sup>ber</sup> A. D. 1713.
