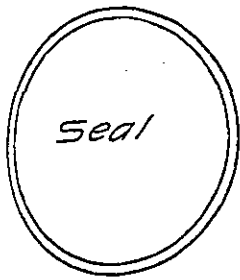

These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out to the s^d Abiah Taylor the s^d quantity or so much as shall be found thereof in that vacancy remaining after Thomas Buffington's survey in ye forks of Brandwine taking ye same even as it runs without culling or choosing, and make return into the General Surveyor's office at Philad^{ia} where this warr^t is to remain and a copy thereof to be del^{vd} to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} 6th of the 2^d moth 1703.
