

I do hereby certify that by virtue of a warrant under the hands<sup>of</sup> seal of Edward Penington, Surveyor General to Isaac Taylor directed bearing date the 16<sup>th</sup> of 10<sup>th</sup> month 170 $\frac{1}{2}$  pursuant to the Proprietaries warrant to the said Edward Penington bearing date the 6<sup>th</sup> of the 1<sup>st</sup> month 170 $\frac{1}{2}$  the said Isaac Taylor hath made returns into the General Surveyors' office of the resurvey of a piece of land resurvey'd to Peter Taylor the 12<sup>th</sup> day of the first month 170 $\frac{1}{2}$  which being examined and revised in the said office is as follows viz. Situate in the township of Upper Providence in the County of Chester beginning at a black oak by Chester road being the corner of Thomas Powel's land from thence running south 32 degrees westerly by the lands of the said Thomas Powel and Thomas Butterfield four hundred twenty two perches to a white oak by Ridley Creek thence up the said Creek by the several courses thereof one hundred and ninety perches to a white oak from thence North 32 degrees easterly by the land of Joseph Baker, Richard Bond and Samuel Robenet four hundred fifty six perches to a white oak by the side of the aforesaid road thence by the said road south south east one hundred and one perches, south 13 deg<sup>s</sup> easterly one hundred and two perches to the first mentioned black oak, containing four hundred and twenty one acres.
