

In pursuance of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated 4th day of November 1713, there was survey'd and laid out the 27th day of the 11th month 1714⁵ for Abiah Taylor of the County of Chester a certain tract of land in the township of Bradford in the said County, beginning at a white oak at a corner of other land of the said Abiah Taylor, thence north north west by Isaac Taylor's land one hundred and two perches to a post thence east by north by vacant land three hundred and twenty ~~perches~~ to a white oak then south south east by the line of the Welch tract one hundred and two ~~hundred and two perches~~ to a post then by the lands of John Cope and the said Abiah Taylor west by south three hundred and twenty ~~perches~~ to the beginning containing two hundred acres.
