acres yt I would grant her to take up five hundred acres in  
ye County of Philadelphia near Pennaapecca and her town  
lots. These are to will & require thee forthwith to survey or cause  
to be survey'd unto her ye sd number of acres in ye sd County  
where not already taken up & her lots in ye City of Phila-  
delphia where they fell and make returns thereof into my  
Secretary's office. Given at Philadelphia ye 3<sup>d</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> 1683.
