Whereas Sr Mathias Vincent, Major Robert Thomson & Doctor  
Daniell Cox of London have desired my warrant for the lay-  
ing out of their six townships of land each containeing five  
thousand acres.

These are therefore to order & require theeforthwith to lay out or  
cause to be laid out the said townships contiguously upon  
the west side of the river Schookill not far from ye river  
that is Cannogable that runneth into the same & with a  
front upon the river Schookill of four miles & an halfe  
if it can be, else four miles lett them have what favor<sup>t</sup>  
in justice they can have & for soe doing this shall bee  
thy warrant. Given this twenty third day of the month  
calld April 1686
