

Whereas William Rakestraw is a purchaser of 2500<sup>g</sup> in the right of himselfe whereby there was a lott belonging to him where it fell in the ffront street w<sup>ch</sup> hapend to be where Edwd. Shiping has built on part thereof containing in breadth fifty one foot and in depth as other lotts and now the s<sup>d</sup> William — finding a part of the s<sup>d</sup> lott vacant and as being his right putts in his Cavett to all other claymes and desires that no grant may be given to any other p<sup>son</sup> or p<sup>sons</sup> untill there be a heereing thereof before the Com<sup>rs</sup> of Property.
