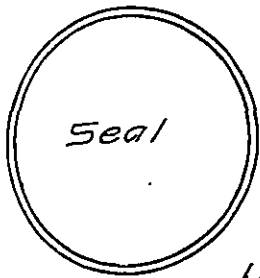


Pennsylvania ss



By the Commissioners of Property.

Upon an agreement made with Isaac Taylor Surveyor of Chester County for one thousand acres of land in the said county for which he is to pay to the Proprietors use within six months after the date hereof one hundred pounds and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for each hundred. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the sd Isaac Taylor according to the method of townships the said quantity of one thousand acres of land in the said county that has not been already surveyed nor taken up nor is seated by the Indians and make return thereof into the Secretaries office. Which survey in case the sd Isaac — fulfill the agreement aforesaid shall be valid otherwise the same shall be void and of no effect as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^a the 23^d day of the first month A.D. 171³/₄
