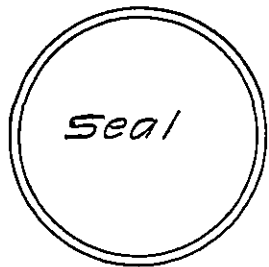


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Richard Murry of Philadelphia County that we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land in part of one thousand ^{acres} the original purchase made of the late Prop^t by Thomas Roberts of London by deeds of lease & re-lease dated the 11th & 12th dayes ^{of August} 1682, whose brother and heir Nathanael Roberts by like deeds dated the 18th & 19th dayes of October 1723, granted & conveyed the same unto the said Richard Murry. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd in ~~the~~ part of the aforesaid right according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and ^{make} returns thereof into the Secretary's office in order for a further confirmation. Given under our hands and the lesser seal of the Province at Philadelphia the tenth day of December Anno Domini 1726.
