vey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and oblake
a returne thereof into the Secretarys office in order ~~for~~ to a
further confirmation oblchick survey in case the said Jacob _____
fulfill the aforesaid agreement shall be valid obltherwise the
same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warr-
ant ever grablted. Given under our handobl \textsterling seale of the
