

By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietary and Governour bearing date the 28th day of 7^{br} 1700 for resurvey^g unto Thomas Withers one hundred acres of land part thereof in right of an~~e~~ old purchase made by his Father William Withers the other part to be now purchased. Survey'd and laid out the 27th 1st month 1701 unto ye said Thomas Withers a tract of land in the County of Chester beginning at a poplar at the corner of the land called Standfields land thence one hundred and twenty eight perches to a black oak then east one hundred and twenty five perches to a black oak then northe one hundred and twenty eight perches to a black oak then west one hundred twenty five perches to the place of the beginning containing one hundred acres.
