



By the Commission<sup>rs</sup> of Property

Upon an agreem<sup>t</sup> between us and Charles Whitacre for a certain parcel of land w<sup>th</sup> in the bounds of that tract formerly laid out to Griffith Jones in Westtown in ye County of Chester adjoining on the lines of the Indians land and taking in the two uppermost corners of the said tract as cutt off by the said lines and extending round the hithermost corner of the said Indian tract till it take in sufficient for a convenient settlem<sup>t</sup> to the quantity of about 3— or 400 acres for w<sup>ch</sup> he hath agreed to pay thirty five pounds for every hundred at or before the first day of ye 6<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> next w<sup>th</sup> <sup>interest</sup> 3 months five pounds on three hundred acres if he take so much deducted on the whole. These are to authorize and require thee to survey to the sd Charles — the said tract of land as above expressed and make returns into the Gen<sup>l</sup> Surveyor's office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary. Which survey & return in case the said Charles — fulfill the agreem<sup>t</sup> afores<sup>d</sup> shall be valid otherwise shall be void and of no other effect than as if ye same had never been made nor this warr<sup>t</sup> ever granted.
