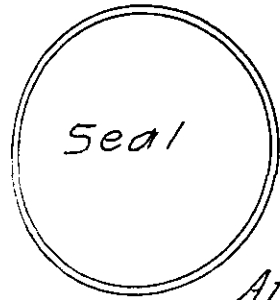


Pennsylvania S.S.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Robert Wilkins of Conestoga that we would grant him to take up near that place one hundred and fifty acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees ffifteen pounds many of Pennsylvania and ye yearly quitrent of one shilling & six pence sterling. These are to authorize and require theeto survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Robert Wilkins at or near Conestoga<sup>o</sup> aforesaid according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of one hundred and ffifty acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said Robert— fulfill the above agreement within three months after ye date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made or this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & the seal of ye Province at Philadelphia the 1<sup>st</sup> day of septem<sup>r</sup> Anno Dni 1718.
