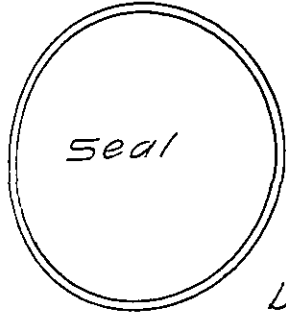


Pennsylvania 55



By the Commissioners of Property

Upon an agreement made with John Wyeth of the County of Chester for a certain piece of vacant land lying between the tract he is now possess'd of and the land of Joseph Gilpin containing about fifty three acres for w^{ch} he is to pay to the Proprietors use within three months at farthest after the rate of five shillings \textsterling acre & ye usual quittr^t for ever hereafter. These are to authorize thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said John Wyeth the said vacant piece of land by ye bounds of the adjacent lands inclosing it, and make return thereof into the Secretaries office. Which survey in case the sd John — comply with the agreement aforesaid, shall be valid otherwise the same shall be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philad^a ye 26th day of the 6th moth 1713.
