At the request of Thomas Wickersham that we would grant him to take up for the use of his Children five hundred acr^s of land being what remaining untaken upp of 1000 acr^s of land ~~pp~~chased of the Proprietary by ~~the~~ ~~sd~~ Humphry Killinbeck who made over one moiety of his sd ~~pp~~chase to the said Thomas Wickersham and ^{of} the residue 200 acres to Humphry eldest son to the sd Thomas ——— and one ^{hundred} acres apiece to Thomas, John and Anne the other children of the sd Tho. Wickersham. These are to authorize thee to survey or cause to be surveyd to the sd Thomas Wickersham (for the use of his sd Children as aforesd) the sd five hundred acres in this Province not already surveyd nor taken upp nor concealed nor seated by the Indians to be laid out according to the method of townships and make returns thereof into the Secretaryes office. Given under our hands and seal of the sd Province at Phil^a the 17th day of 10^{br} th Aug 1701
