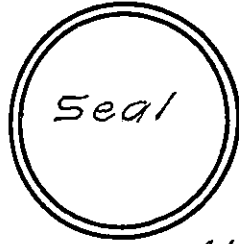


Pennsylvania 55.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of John William of Merion that we would grant him to take up among the branches of the French creek the quantity of four hundred acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the trustees ^{of this Province} forty pounds money of Pennsylvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said John William at the place aforesaid according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of four hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in case the said John William fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & the seal of the Province at Philad^a the 18th day of November Anno Dⁿⁱ 1718.
