



Pursuant to a warrant from the Prop^{rs} Comm^{rs} dated the 5th of 9^{br} 1714. I survey'd unto Anne Welch in right of Robt Jones's purchase a certain tract of land in the township of Calh in the County of Chester.

Begining at a corner marked black oak being a corner of John Davis's land thence south by vacant land sixty perches to a chestnut tree thence east by south by ye land late of Eliz-Jones Mary Leech & Anne Erbery one hundred & sixty seven p^{ches} to a black oak thence south by west by ye same land sixty two p^{ches} to a white oak thence east by vacant land one hundred & eighty two perches to a post thence north by a line of marked trees one hundred and twenty eight perches to a post thence west by ye Prop^{rs} land eighty eight perches to a post thence north by ye same land twenty five perches to a post thence west by the land of the sd John Davis two hundred and fifty six perches to the place of begining containing two hundred & twenty acres with the allowance of six P. cent
