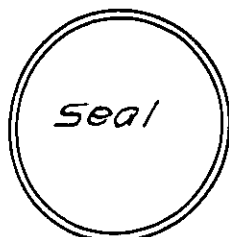

At the request of James Wright of the County of Chester that we we would grant him to take ^{up} two hundred acres of land in the said County for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use twenty pounds for the whole & the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said James Wright in ye said County according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a return thereof into the Secretary's office w^{ch} survey in case the said James — fulfill the above agreem^t within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted.
