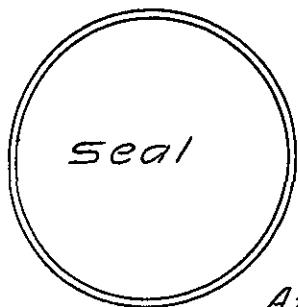


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of William Willis of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up amongst the late surveys made back in the said county ^{the quantity of two hundred acres of land} for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet^s use twenty pounds m^ony of Pennsylvania, for the whole & the yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said William Willis in the said county according to ye method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians & make returns thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said William — fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province ^{at Philad^a} the tenth day of October Anno Dⁿⁱ 1717.
