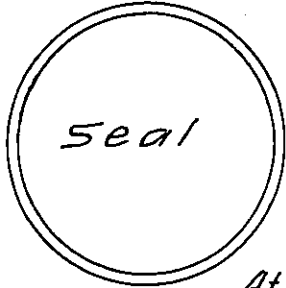

At the request of Thomas Withers, Attorney, for James Wallace that we would grant him to take up for the sd James Wallace in right of his purchase of one thousand acres, five hundred acres the remainder of the sd purchase. These are to require thee forthwith to survey and lay out to the said James Wallace the said number of five hundred acres of land (in full of his said purchase) that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by the Indians, and make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by ye Secretary. Given under ~~our~~ ^{our} hands & ^{ye} seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 14th of the 2^d moth 1702.
