At the request of Hannah Musgrove that I would grant
her to take up twenty acres of ~~liberty~~ land within the
liberties of Philad^{ia} in consideration of a purchase of one
thousand acres made by William Bennet ^{of} who tho' not in the
numbers of the first purchasers sold wrongfully to the said
^{or by^e assigns from whom she derives}
Hannah ye s^d number of acres but relinquishing the said
claim gives a valuable consideration of other land for ye same.

These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be
survey'd to the s^d Hannah Musgrove the s^d number of acres
within ye s^d liberties on the west side of Skuylkill where
not already survey'd nor taken up & make returns thereof
into my Secretaries office. Given under my hand and
seal at Philad^{ia} the 6th day of 8^{br} 1701.
