



Situate in Dover (late Newberry) town-

ship in the County of York containing within the black lines as above represented 100<sup>9</sup> and 40 perch and the usual allowance &c<sup>9</sup> originally surveyed by Charles Lutrens late D.S. on the 3d day of June 1771 for Charles Stauterhauer in pursuance of Mathias Raslers application No. 5217 for 100<sup>9</sup> dated the 24 of October 1768 now owned and occupied by George Coble, Henry & John Richcreek. Examined & Returned 15<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1831 per contract. Report. The above is included in a survey of 237<sup>acs</sup> made and returned in pursuance of two warrants, one granted to John Richenbach dated 21 August 1788 and the other granted to John Righabough dated 25 October 1791 and the whole patented to said Righenbaugh alias Richcreek the 11 day of November 1791. The dotted lines represent the residue of the 237<sup>acs</sup>.
